Everybody that made it to the field was treated with free donuts. -By the way, the new keys should work for all locks, gates and pin box.

While Andreas was handing out the keys to the new lock, Dion (one of our new-



est members!) and Dennis were painting the storage sheds. Dennis had picked

World Model Pylon Races



The pylon season started a bit rocky this year. In part this was due to the fact that there was a lot going on organizing various

club administration activities (mostly boring but important stuff), because our Greenspot field is currently under renovation, and most recently, because Joe Augino, our Event Coordinator had his Laptop crash on him (not figuratively). This also shows that RC planes are not the only devices that can crash!

We are very close to a final decision how our pylon racers should look like in the future. Based on some field tests of Chris Gaultier and Joe Augino we have found that the speed differences and flight characteristics of Quickie 500 type planes (Class 424) and our World Model planes are almost non existent. This is with either an OS Max LA .40 or a Magnum .28 as a

power plant. Below are the current tentative rules for our new race planes.

We have to confirm these new rules with the Gilman Springs fliers and then we are all set. Because of various activities we plan on having the next race at Greenspot on Saturday, May 24. This is, however, a tentative date, as we want to finish resurfacing our runway before we have the next race. If you have questions please ask Joe, he should be back on-line by the end of the week. (abl)

The following planes qualify for the races:

- All old World Model types (the ones we used so far)
- Quickie 500 type, class 424 planes
- Planes that have the following characteristics:
 - Must have a weight of at least 3lbs 3oz
 - ♦ Must have at least a span width of 48"
 - Must have at least a wing area (only wing) of 430 sq inch
 - Must be certified before a race (only once) by a club official. The main criterion is that the plane flies not faster than 86 mph in horizontal flight.

Redlands Fly-In 2008

Note from the Editors: This is from an e-mail that went out to all MARKS members on March 4th.

When is the Fly-In?

The Redlands Fly-In 2008 will be held on **Saturday May 10th**, that is, one day before Mother's Day.

What is new and/or improved?

Four Club event: This year we will have members from four local clubs participating and showing their favorite RC models. Such an organization allows us to have an awesome static display and some serious flying power for our demonstrations.

The four clubs are MARKS, AMAA, PVMAC, and Gilman Springs.

New location: Because of construction work in front of the FBO we will have the event on the West side of the airport. The



area is much larger and much better suited for an air show, especially for us RC modelers. Below is a list of cool facts about the new location:

- Our setup is in show center
- We will be protected by a large hangar from any prop wind of full scale planes and because we are with the back to a hangar crowd control will be easier
- We will have electricity from the hangars
- There will be a runway access that is strictly for RC models
- We will have much more space for our display
- · Access will be much easier
- There will be a static and a semi static full scale display area and vendors will be nearby.
- More and closer parking is available
- Todd Housley who was organizing the first two Redlands Fly-In's is back this year.
- There will be a NOTAM in effect so that Redlands is a controlled airspace during the Redlands Fly (unlike last year where there was none)
- Like last year this will be again an AMA Sanctioned Event (Class D or C)

How can you participate?

Our goal is to have an awesome static display with different sections showing all the beautiful aspects of our hobby. We want to have planes from all time periods of aviation, trainers, small planes, electric planes, giant scale, IMAC, helicopters, jets, scale planes, basically everything that flies, presents nicely, and is controlled via RC or wire.

So bring out your models of which you are most proud of - the more models we have the better. It would be really nice if we



could group those planes thematically, e.g., having a WW I section, an electric section, a jet section, and so forth.

Also, if you would like to volunteer please let us know.

If you have ideas what we could do in addition to the planned activities let us know too.

Air Show Program

Like last year we will have a number of 10 to 15 minute slots where we can perform some flight demonstrations. Because of weather (e.g., wind) and other activities that are difficult to anticipate the show block schedule is dynamic, that is, we fly when we have an open window (1 - 2 times every hour). For this purpose we will, like last year, create different show block types that a) show our hobby from all aspects and b) have different requirements concerning space and weather. Thus we are as flexible as possible.

The demonstrations are like last year by invitation only. You can, however, apply for a flying spot in one of the slots by sending an e-mail to any one of us (Andreas (abl@esri.com), Harry (hjhill@verizon.net), Rick (KillerLoki51@roadrunner.com), Marty (Everett211@aol.com), or Bob (EstrellaRC@hughes.net). We will then see where to fit you in our program. If you have ideas for other presentations please let us know as well. Again, like last year we will have an on-line forum page where we add additional information and where everybody



that wants to can leave feedback.

Here are the show block types that we are currently planning to have (not in order):

- Welcome Banner Fly-By and IMAC Acrobatic Intro
- Free Style Demos (large scale acrobatic plane)
- Warbird WW II demo
- Warbird WW I demo
- ♦ Good OI' times flying slot

- Electric Extravaganza
- Heli Demo
- Student & Teacher demo
- Turbine jet demo
- ??? Your ideas here ???



Depending on the time we get allotted and the reception by spectators we can have some show blocks multiple times.

President's Corner



Hello everybody,

Here are a couple of items on my current MARKS radar screen that I would like to share with you.

New Keys and Locks

Last weekend, I unfortunately had to scratch the idea of becoming a "Weather Girl" and becoming a big star on TV. With my weather predic-



tion being so wrong - it was nice on the originally planned date but cold, windy, and humid on the day when we actually had the event - it seems wiser to do chose a different career. - Besides the weather, however, we had a good time and got a lot done that day at the field. If you haven't been out to Greenspot it is probably worthwhile going to see the progress that we have made in renovating our field. - Back to the keys: The new keys should open all gates and the pin box; if you have no key then you can obtain one either from Chuck (Rialto) or from me (Redlands), or at any regular MARKS meeting.

Greenspot Runway Update

We have pretty much decided what we are going to do concerning the renovation of our current field until we can move to the new area. We are going to minimize cost wherever possible and apply the "most bang for the buck" rule and at the same time gather experience for our new field. At the next meeting we are going to have our members vote on this renovation. Once we have the blessing for the project we should be able to start within a month. Besides some preliminary planning and cleaning work (weeds) we will need volunteers that help on the day where we resurface the runway. We will basically cover the existing runway with a layer of sand, fix all holes, then roll and compress it, and finally fixate the sand with a water polymer mixture. This produces a very smooth and solid surface when done right. We should be able to do everything in one day but ... we need a lot of help from as many people as possible, as our

runway is BIG. As soon as we are done with planning and have confirmed a date for the runway work, we will give you a heads up so you can put the date into your calendars.

Setup Bench

Another project that I am currently working on is a prototype of a setup bench for Greenspot. I had heard that our friends at Norton have built some really nice benches so I drove out there and did some "work espionage". And indeed they have a very nice setup! — I took some pictures and began to draw some plans.



There were two main construction details that I changed: One change involves the plane restrainers and the other the working surface. The prototype has retractable restrainers and its working area is a square (Check the pictures for details). As materials I used standard sized lumber (2x3, 2x4, and 2x6) as well as a pine board (1x8). Building the bench



took only a few hours and you can easily build one over a weekend. Erik is going to draw plans and we are going to post them online. It would be great of some of you guys could build a couple too – it is so

much easier to come out to the field and have a couple of setup benches already there to use! – Please let me know if you are interested and I can give you some pointers. – Oh, yes, the price for all the parts is relatively low – I have to do the final calculations because I bought too much wood but my estimate is that a table is between \$50 and \$70.

Boring but Important

Well, I don't know many people that enjoy



doing taxes (if there are any in our club please let me know immediately as I'll have something to do for you!!!). – Because we are now a real non-profit corporation, we need to send our

yearly report to Uncle Sam as well. It used to be that organizations with revenues of less than \$25'000 were exempt from filing a tax report: Not so anymore. Thus if you see me walking up and down the runway a bit grumpy and over worked then it is probably because I think IRS Form 990.

On the other IRS related topic, that is, in regard to our formal tax exempt status 501(c)(3) (Form 1023) we have not yet received any feedback. However, we should hear something back from the IRS any day now. Depending on the feedback we have to file a revision of our application or we might also be done completely.

Signs

At the last meeting Vic Bradley wasn't paying attention for just a moment and before he knew it, he had "volunteered" to make the direction signs for Greenspot. We have already made up our mind how



the signs should look like and how they are supposed to be constructed. – Expect to see the new signs soon; they will help guide new members and visitors to the flying site.


President's Corner (continued)

Control Club of San Diego who contributed \$100 in his club's name to our new runway!—Thanks a lot from all of us!


I am looking forward to a time when we can do the same for other clubs.
